

Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Honduras ranks #120 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 8 in Central America.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035


In Honduras, the age 65+ population will increase 126% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 23%. For comparison, Honduras's age 65+ growth rate ranks #51 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Central America.




Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

The old age dependency ratio in Honduras is 9.3. The old age dependency ratio in Honduras is 9.3. The old age states are 9.3 people age 65+ per 100 people 20-64. Based on this ratio, Honduras ranks #114 out 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of Central America, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Honduras was 23.4. The country ranks #138 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 8 in Central America.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




