




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In the Philippines, the age 65+ population will increase 113% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 26%. For comparison, the Philippines's age 65+ growth rate ranks #76 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65-100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does the Philippines compare?

The old age dependency ratio in the Philippines is 8.6. This means there are 8.6 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, the Philippines ranks #124 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



In 2015, the median age in the Philippines was 24.2. The country ranks #132 out of 201 nations and territories in the


