




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Rwanda, the age 65+ population will increase 146% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 42%. For comparison, Rwanda's age 65+ growth rate ranks #29 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 654 per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Rwanda compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Rwanda is 6.1. This means there are 6.1 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Rwanda ranks #182 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #17 out of 20 in Eastern Africa, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Rwanda was 19.2. The country ranks #167 out of 201 nations and territories in the world and #6 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

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
