



Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Bolivia ranks #97 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 13 in South America.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Bolivia, the age 65+ population will increase 78% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 26%. For comparison, Bolivia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #128 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #11 out of 13 in South America.

The old age dependency ratio in Bolivia is 12.7. This means there are 12.7 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Bolivia ranks #84 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 13 in South America, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Bolivia was 24.1. The country ranks #134 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #13 out of 13 in South America.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Bolivia is projected to average 69.6 from 2015-2020, ranking #138 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #12 out of 13 in South America.

The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Bolivia was 51.5% in 2015, ranking #24 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
