




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Switzerland, the age 65+ population will increase 63% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 12%. For comparison, Switzerland's age 65+ growth rate rank: #156 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 7 in Western Europe.






