

### Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Angola ranks #197 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

# Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Angola, the age 65+ population will increase 118% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 70%. For comparison, Angola's age 65+ growth rate ranks #68 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Middle Africa.




### Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

#### "Old Age" Dependency Ratio





#### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Angola compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Angola is 5.9. This neans there are 5.9 people age 65+ per 100 people age 0-64. Based on this ratio, Angola ranks #188 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 9 in Middle Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Angola was 16.1. The country ranks #198 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

#### Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Angola is projected to average 53.7 from 2015-2020, ranking #195 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

### Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015



The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Angola was 44.8% in 2015, ranking #36 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
