



Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Eritrea ranks #187 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #18 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Eritrea, the age 65+ population will increase 86% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 47%. For comparison, Eritrea's age 65+ growth rate ranks #117 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #13 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.




Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Eritrea compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Eritrea is 5.9. This neans there are 5.9 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Eritrea ranks #188 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #19 out of 20 in Eastern Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Eritrea was 18.6. The country ranks #174 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #11 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65



Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Eritrea is projected to average 65.1 from 2015-2020, ranking #161 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #10 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.
