What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age $65+$ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does France compare?

The old age dependency ratio in France is 33.8. This means there are 33.8 people age $65+$ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, France ranks \#8 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and \#2 out of 7 in Western Europe, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.


In 2015, the median age in France was 41 .2. The country ranks \#27 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and \#6 out of 7 in Western Europe.

Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in France is projected to average 82.9 from 2015-2020, ranking \#10 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and \#2 out of 7 in Western Europe.

## Poverty Rate, Age 65+
