Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Austria ranks #18 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 7 in Western Europe.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Austria, the age 65+ population will increase 52% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 3%. For comparison, Austria's age 65+ growth rate ranks #164 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 7 in Western Europe.




Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





Nhat is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Austria compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Austria is 30.4. This means there are 30.4 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Austria ranks #20 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 7 ir Western Europe, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Austria was 43.2. The country ranks #8 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 7 in Western Europe.




Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015




The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Austria was 5.9% in 2015, ranking #155 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
