




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Argentina, the age 65+ population will increase 50% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 15%. For comparison, Argentina's age 65+ growth rate ranks #169 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #12 out of 13 in South America.




