




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Bhutan, the age 65+ population will increase 124% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 15%. For comparison, Bhutan's age 65+ growth rate ranks #5% out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Southern Asia

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 654 per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Bhutan compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Bhutan is 8.6. This means there are 8.6 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Bhutan ranks #124 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 9 in Southern Asia, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Bhutan was 26.7. The country ranks #114 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Southern Asia.


