





Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Congo-Kinshasa ranks #172 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035


In Congo-Kinshasa, the age 65+ population will increase 100% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 67%. For comparison, Congo-Kinshasa's age 65+ growth rate ranks #98 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 9 in Middle Africa.



what is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Congo-Kinshasa compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Congo-Kinshasa is 7.3. This means there are 7.3 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Congo-Kinshasa ranks #150 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 9 in Middle Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Congo-Kinshasa was 16.9. The country ranks #193 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Congo-Kinshasa is projected to average 59.9 from 2015-2020, ranking #183 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 9 in Middle Africa.

The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Congo Kinshasa was 62.3% in 2015, ranking #9 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
