




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Zimbabwe, the age 65+ population will increase 65% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 43%. For comparison, Zimbabwe's age 65+ growth rate rank #152 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #19 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+
per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended
to measure burden on the working population to provide

How does Zimbabwe compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Zimbabwe is 6.6. This means there are 6.6 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Zimbabwe ranks #171 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #13 out of 20 in Eastern Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



In 2015, the median age in Zimbabwe was 18.9. The country ranks #169 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.
