

#### Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Tanzania ranks #161 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #10 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

## Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Tanzania, the age 65+ population will increase 102% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 67%. For comparison, Tanzania's age 65+ growth rate ranks #94 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #11 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.




#### Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

#### "Old Age" Dependency Ratio





#### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Tanzania compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Tanzania is 7.8. This neans there are 7.8 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Tanzania ranks #143 out of 01 nations and territories in the world, and #10 out of 20 in Eastern Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Tanzania was 17.3. The country ranks #189 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #15 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

#### Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Tanzania is projected to average 66.4 from 2015-2020, ranking #153 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 20 in Eastern Africa.

#### Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015



The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Tanzania was 61.5% in 2015, ranking #10 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
