

Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017





Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035


In Singapore, the age 65+ population will increase 168% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 13%. For comparison, Singapore's age 65+ growth rate ranks #19 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

low does Singapore compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Singapore is 17.6. This means there are 17.6 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Singapore ranks #62 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #1 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Singapore was 40.0. The country ranks #37 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #1 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Singapore is projected to average 83.7 from 2015-2020, ranking #4 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #1 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.
