




# Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Latvia, the age 65+ population will increase 7% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will shrink 10%. For comparison, Latvia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #200 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #11 out of 1 in Northern Europe.



Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Latvia is projected to average 74.5 from 2015-2020, ranking #100 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #10 out of 11 in Northern Europe.

## Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015



The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Latvia was 10.7% in 2015, ranking #128 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
