




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Bangladesh, the age 65+ population will increase 121% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 17%. For comparison, Bangladesh's age 65+ growth rate ranks #63 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 9 in Southern Asia.





Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Bangladesh is projected to average 72.9 from 2015-2020, ranking #114 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 9 in Southern Asia.
