

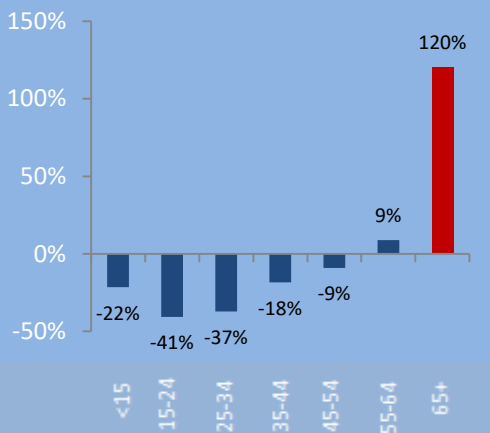
## Taiwan, China

Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017



Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Taiwan ranks #55 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Eastern Asia.

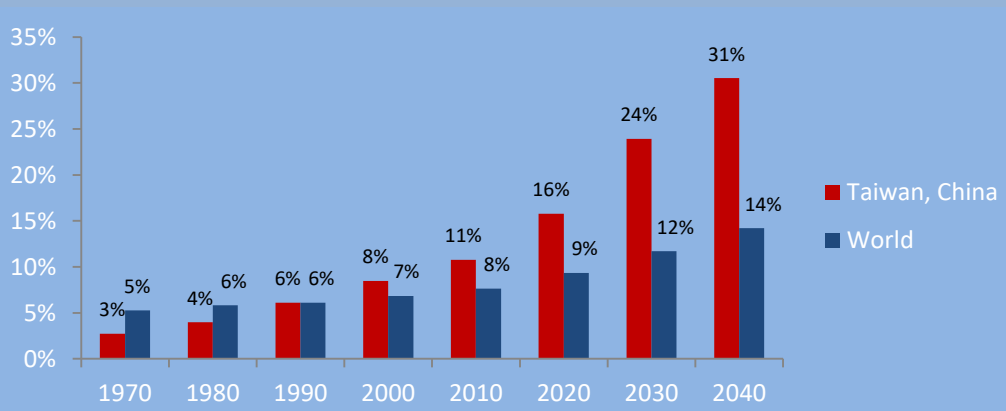


Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Taiwan, the age 65+ population will increase 120% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will shrink 3%. For comparison, Taiwan's age 65+ growth rate ranks #64 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Eastern Asia.

## "Old Age" Dependency Ratio

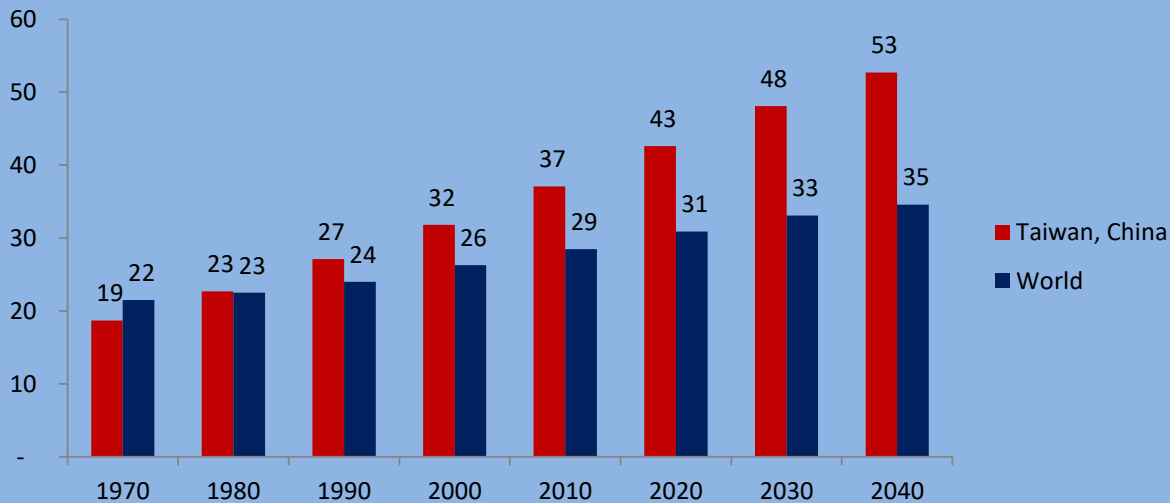
### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

### How does Taiwan compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Taiwan is 18.0. This means there are 18.0 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Taiwan ranks #60 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Eastern Asia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.

## Median Age: 1970-2040



In 2015, the median age in Taiwan was 39.7. The country ranks #39 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Eastern Asia.

Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Taiwan is projected to average 80.3 from 2015-2020, ranking #39 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 8 in Eastern Asia.
