



#### Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Slovakia ranks #43 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 10 in Eastern Europe.

### Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Slovakia, the age 65+ population will increase 51% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will shrink 3%. For comparison, Slovakia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #168 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 10 in Eastern Europe.

#### "Old Age" Dependency Ratio





#### §What is a dependency ratio

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Slovakia compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Slovakia is 21.0. This means there are 21.0 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Slovakia ranks #52 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 10 in Eastern Europe, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Slovakia was 39.1. The country ranks #44 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 10 in Eastern Europe.

#### Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Slovakia is projected to average 76.7 from 2015-2020, ranking #66 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 10 in Eastern Europe.

### Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015



The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Slovakia was 2.4% in 2015, ranking #177 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
