## Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017






## Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Portugal, the age 65+ population will increase 34% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will shrink 5%. For comparison, Portugal's age 65+ growth rate ranks #182 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 12 in Southern Europe.

#### "Old Age" Dependency Ratio





#### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Portugal compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Portugal is 34.7. This means there are 34.7 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Portugal ranks #6 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 12 in Southern Europe, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Portugal was 44.0. The country ranks #5 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 12 in Southern Europe.

#### Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Portugal is projected to average 81.7 from 2015-2020, ranking #22 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 12 in Southern Europe.

### Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015




The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Portugal was 12.6% in 2015, ranking #119 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
