



Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Ghana ranks #156 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 16 in Western Africa.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Ghana, the age 65+ population will increase 94% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 40%. For comparison, Ghana's age 65+ growth rate ranks #103 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #11 out of 16 in Western Africa.




Percent of Population Age 65+: 1970-2040

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





§What is a dependency ratio

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Ghana compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Ghana is 7.1. This neans there are 7.1 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Ghana ranks #157 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 16 in Western Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Ghana was 20.6. The country ranks #155 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 16 in Western Africa.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Ghana is projected to average 62.0 from 2015-2020, ranking #176 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 16 in Western Africa.

The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Ghana was 57.1% in 2015, ranking #15 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
