



Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Nicaragua ranks #112 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 8 in Central America.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035


In Nicaragua, the age 65+ population will increase 145% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 17%. For comparison, Nicaragua's age 65+ growth rate ranks #31 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 8 in Central America.

An "Old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees. The old age dependency ratio in Nicaragua is 9.3. This neans there are 9.3 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Nicaragua ranks #114 out of 01 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 8 in Central America, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Nicaragua was 25.2. The country ranks #125 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 8 in Central America.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Nicaragua is projected to average 75.9 from 2015-2020, ranking #77 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 8 in Central America.

The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Nicaragua was 28.6% in 2015, ranking #63 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
