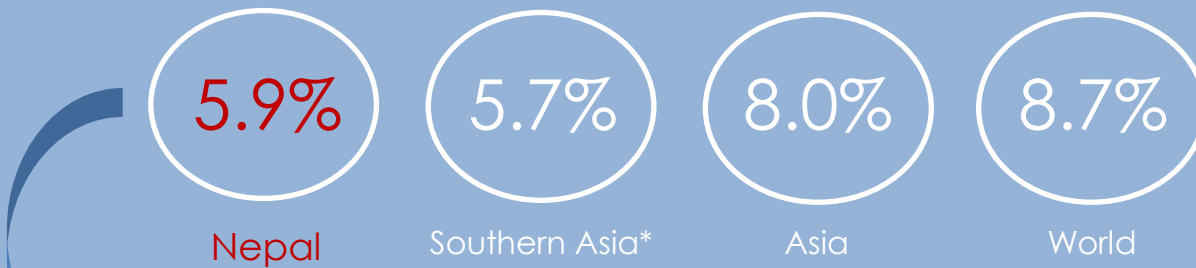


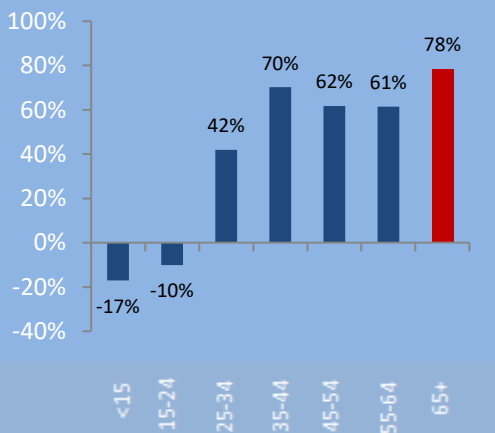
## Nepal

Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017



Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Nepal ranks #108 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Southern Asia.

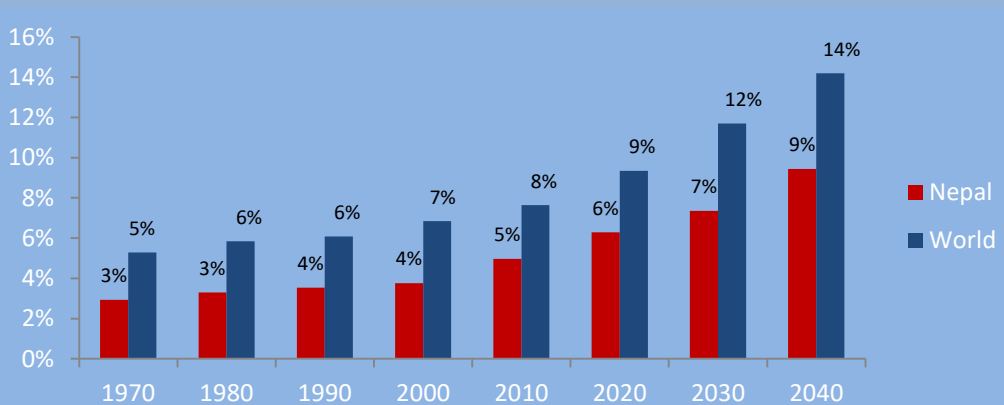


Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Nepal, the age 65+ population will increase 78% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 17%. For comparison, Nepal's age 65+ growth rate ranks #130 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 9 in Southern Asia.

## "Old Age" Dependency Ratio

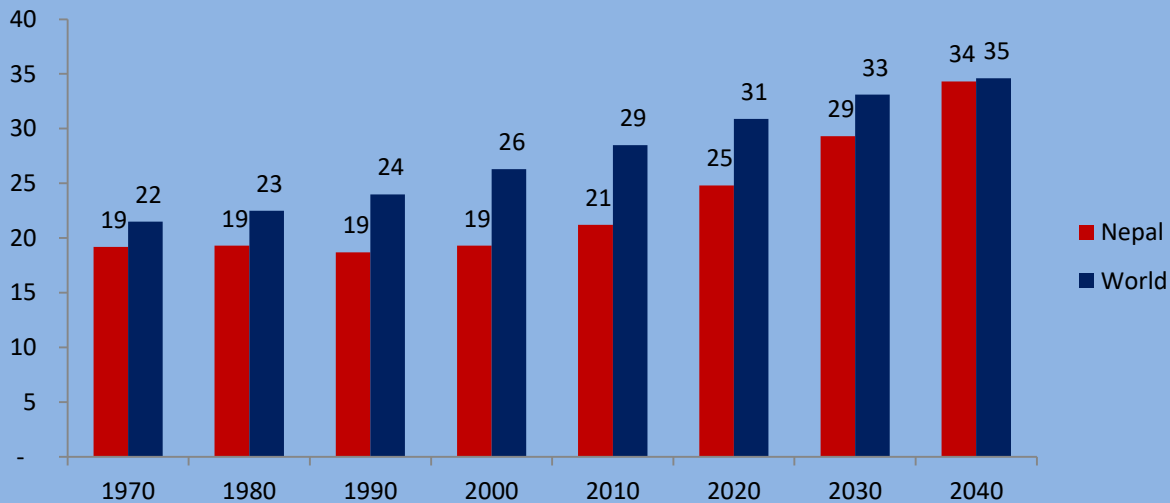
### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

### How does Nepal compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Nepal is 11.0. This means there are 11.0 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Nepal ranks #103 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 9 in Southern Asia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.

## Median Age: 1970-2040



In 2015, the median age in Nepal was 23.1. The country ranks #139 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 9 in Southern Asia.

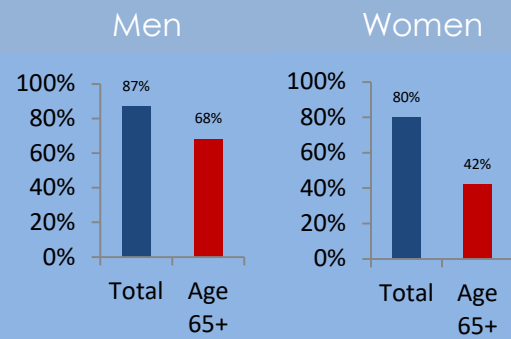

Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Nepal is projected to average 70.9 from 2015-2020, ranking #126 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 9 in Southern Asia.

## Labor Force Participation Rate, 2015



The combined labor force participation rate among men and women age 65+ in Nepal was 53.9% in 2015, ranking #21 out of the 180 nations and territories for which this is measured.
