




African Republic ranks #143 out of 201 nations and territories in the



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees

How does Central African Republic compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Central African Republic is 8.3. This means there are 8.3 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Central African Republic ranks #133 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Middle Africa, in terms of pressure on working populations to



In 2015, the median age in Central African Republic was 20.0. The country ranks #158 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 9 in Middle Africa.


