






Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Norway, the age 65+ population will increase 569 between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 15%. For comparison, Norway's age 65+ growth rate ranks #162 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 11 in Northern Europe.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 654 per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Norway compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Norway is 27.5. This means there are 27.5 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Norway ranks #29 out o 201 nations and territories in the world, and #8 out of 1 in Northern Europe, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Norway was 39.1. The country ranks #44 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 11 in Northern Europe.


