


# Qatar




# Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Qatar, the age 65+ population will increase 650% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 24%. For comparison, Qatar's age 65+ growth rate ranks #2 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 18 in Western Asia.

## "Old Age" Dependency Ratio





#### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Qatar compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Qatar is 1.5. This means there are 1.5 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Qatar ranks #200 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #17 out of 18 in Western Asia, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Qatar was 30.7. The country ranks #84 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and


