



Percent of Population Age 65+, 2017




Based on the percent of its population age 65+ in 2017, Turkmenistan ranks #135 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 5 in Central Asia.

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035


In Turkmenistan, the age 65+ population will increase 142% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 15%. For comparison, Turkmenistan's age 65+ growth rate ranks #34 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 5 in Central Asia.

"Old Age" Dependency Ratio





What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Turkmenistan compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Turkmenistan is 7.1. This means there are 7.1 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Turkmenistan ranks #157 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 5 in Central Asia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



Median Age: 1970-2040

In 2015, the median age in Turkmenistan was 26.4. The country ranks #118 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 5 in Central Asia.

Life Expectancy (Age) At Age 65




Total life expectancy at birth among all men and women born in Turkmenistan is projected to average 66.1 from 2015-2020, ranking #155 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 5 in Central Asia.
